# **East Surrey Hospital - Emergency Department Induction guide for Imperial Medical Students**

Welcome to the Emergency Medicine department in East Surrey Hospital, Redhill. I have included all information needed to help final year students during their placement in Emergency medicine and complete essential competencies required before the final sign off by your mentor.

Please read the information provided with regards to your placement, key contacts and educational opportunities within SASH ED. You will be based in the East Surrey Hospital which offers acute management for around 125,000 patients per year with an average of 375 new patients per day. The designated areas to observe include:-

- Rapid assessment area run by ED Registrar, senior nurse with an HCA, who are the first contacts to all patient arriving in the ED by ambulance.
- **Resuscitation room** treating trauma, burns, medical, surgical, orthopaedic, O&G & Paediatric emergencies.
- Majors area with 23 cubicles including 5 HDU cubicle A to D.
- Paediatric ED with two resuscitation room, two HDU cubicle and seven treatment bays.
- Minor injury area managed by practitioners who can supervise your practical skills.

## **INDUCTION MEETING**

Please meet Claire Parsonage on Extn 1594, in the Education centre for generic induction, access to library, ID badge, which must be worn in all clinical areas. Please meet Dr. Kamal Veeramuthu, your mentor who will give a detailed induction. You should email <a href="mailto:claireparsonage@nhs.net">claireparsonage@nhs.net</a> and <a href="mailto:k.veeramuthu@nhs.net">k.veeramuthu@nhs.net</a> if you are unable to attend ED and if this is not done, then your absence will be notified to medical school.

#### **YOUR ROLE**

You should observe and learn management of acute emergencies, by working in various areas in ED under supervision. You are expected to take history, examine and present patients to senior doctors, who will provide constructive feedback to refine your presentational skills. Please be enthusiastic to improve your clinical and practical skills relevant to your curriculum. You are responsible to address your learning needs supported by Educational fellows and ED mentor before the final sign off.

#### **DRESS CODE**

Please follow infection control policy available in trust PC's and follow strict hand hygiene in clinical areas. You can use your own scrubs or wear clothes which look professional in all clinical areas. Please wear shoes made of wipeable material and not open toe shoes or sandals to avoid injuries. Please keep your hair clean, tidy with long hair tied back when you are in ED. With regards to jewellery, you can wear stud earrings, plain wedding ring and no visible body piercings or tongue studs.

# **TIMETABLE**

The shift patterns will enable students to observe various pathological conditions presenting in ED. You should attend night shift on Saturday & Sunday followed by a day off on Monday.

Week 1	08:00 - 17:00	ED CDU then attend ED Majors zone
Week 2	10:00 - 18:00	Adult & Paediatric Resuscitation + RATS zone
Week 3	15:00 to 22:00	Minors & Paediatric ED

## Week 1 - ED Clinical Decision + Majors (08:00 - 17:00)

CDU ward offers an opportunity to learn social aspects of care to understand impact of drug, alcohol abuse, domestic violence, homelessness, self-harm, mental health issues and MDT input to safely discharge elderly patients. In Majors zone you will have opportunities to clerk, complete practical skills under supervision and present to senior doctors in ED to improve your case presentation skills.

08:00- 08:20	ED handover in MDT room
08:20 - 09:00	Shadow CDU FY2 doctor (bleep 343)
09:00 - 09:15	CDU handover in ED staff room attended by CDU Consultant, FY2, Physiotherapist & Mental health nurse
09:15 - 10:30	Join ED CDU Consultant on their ward rounds.
10:30 - 17.00	Examine patients in majors bay and present to senior doctors in ED

## Week 2 - Resuscitation & Rapid assessment zone (10:00 - 18:00)

Attend all emergency calls (chest pain, cardiac arrest, trauma, major haemorrhage, stroke calls) in HDU & Resuscitation rooms in both Adult & Paediatric ED. You can follow patients to cardiac cath lab, CT room for trauma CT or follow an intubated patient to ITU to learn management of unwell patients.

Please stay in RATS zone to perform cannulation, venepuncture, ABG, ECG, urinary catheterisation etc. You will be allocated stable patients to clerk, examine and then present to senior doctors, who will give you feedback on your case presentational skills.

#### Week 3 - Paediatric ED & Minors (15:00 - 22:00)

Observe and learn management of all conditions presenting to the minor injury unit located within the ED. Attend Paediatric ED to observe and examine children with various conditions by shadowing a dedicated senior doctor.

#### **AIMS OF ED MODULE**

Emergency department offer comprehensive exposure to all speciality emergencies with access to all practical skills taught under supervision. You should focus on :-

- Implementing knowledge gained until now when you clerk patients
- develop skills learnt from speciality clinical placements
- how to manage a unwell patients using ABCDE approach
- managing specific chronic medical conditions
- Take focused history, examination and referral process using SBAR.
- Perform practical skills in ED like suturing, plastering, urinary catheter ABG etc.
- Role of the MDT team in managing acutely unwell patients.
- To understand how errors in acute care be avoided in ED
- To practice supervised prescription writing in acute setting
- Acquire professional skills as a foundation doctor

# **Knowledge Outcomes**

It is expected that by the end of the module the students will be able to:

- Define and describe the management of an acutely undifferentiated sick patient
- Define and describe the management of emergencies in all specialities
- Define and describe the management chronic medical conditions.

## **Professional Attitudes**

Aim to demonstrate professional attributes required when dealing with patients in the ED.

- Commitment to professionalism & organisational skills
- Problem solving and decision making
- Limitations (know when to call for help)
- Working effectively with all team members.
- Effective communication with patients and between professionals

#### **Skills Outcome**

- Initial management of Cardiac arrest & Major Trauma patients
- Anaphylaxis, Shock & Sepsis patients
- Collapsed / Unconscious patient
  - Overdose (medical and psychological impact)
  - Pre-surgical management of the acute abdomen and fractures
  - Musculoskeletal injuries
  - Head, face & spinal injuries
  - ENT & maxillofacial emergencies
  - Wound & Burn management
  - Needle stick injuries

# <u>Procedural skills under supervision</u>

- Wound assessment including suturing.
- Applying slings and back slabs
- Urine dip and pregnancy test
- Perform ECG, ABG, BM stix test & urinary cathetrisation
- Cannulate, take bloods and set up IV drip
- Delivering Oxygen & Nebulisers
